### Rockland Cemetery

This 156-acre gem, established in 1847, is only about 25% 'developed'. The other 75% is prime wooded area with a beautiful river view.

The cemetery was created by Eleazar Lord in 1846. He was an author, educator, and the first President of the Erie Railroad. Dr. Lord envisioned a cemetery that would become prominent as a resting place for the deceased of the New York City area. To that end, he brought his railroad and passengers to the little town of Piermont.

Rockland Cemetery is non-profit and non-sectarian. What is more, the amenities of the eternal repose are moderately priced at Rockland Cemetery. Lot prices are set by a Board of Trustees. Charges for actual internments are fixed by the New York State Cemetery Board.
