Obituary for Anacleta C. Dumlao Anacleta Castillo Dumlao of Piermont, NY passed away on Friday, March 27 at the age of 84. Born in the Philippines, she graduated from the College of Medicine, University of the Philippines in 1963 where she met her husband Themy Dumlao.

Anacleta joined her husband in the United States in August 1963. She trained at St. Elizabeth Hospital in Youngstown, Ohio, then moved to New York and worked at Beekman Downtown Hospital before becoming the overall outpatient manager at Greenpoint Hospital in Brooklyn. After her stay at Metropolitan Hospital she moved to Rockland County, NY where she went into private practice of internal medicine with privileges from both Nyack and Good Samaritan Hospitals for over 30 years.

A quiet and private person, Anacleta had many friends and always had a ready smile for you. She was dedicated to her husband, Themy, whom she unfortunately lost to cancer in 2011, but luckily Anacleta and Themy were able to travel extensively during their 48 year marriage.
