Rae Ann Lovelace was born June 20, 1966, in Port of Spain, Trinidad and Tobago. She was the daughter of the late Hilda Lovelace and the late Lenox Renaud. Rae Ann was the beloved wife of Trevor Wills and the devoted mother of Trevor Wills Jr. She was also the mother of the late Anastasia Lovelace.
